## Overview

The Supply Point Administration Agreement (SPAA) sets out the inter-operational arrangements between gas suppliers and transporters in the UK retail market. It is a multi-party agreement to which all domestic gas suppliers and all gas transporters are required by their Licences to accede.

## SPAA and SPAA Ltd Closure Project

SPAA Ltd have been supporting the Switching Programme with expert resource for several years. This resulted in the creation of the Retail Energy Code (REC), the Central Switching Service and Retail Energy Code Company Ltd (RECCo). The creation of these entities will have a profound impact on the SPAA, which will ultimately migrate to REC and therefore SPAA Ltd will no longer be required.

At the SPAA Executive Committee (EC) meeting in June 2020, members approved the Closure Project which covers the activities required until SPAA Ltd is struck from Companies House, expected approximately six months after REC implementation. The REC implementation is expected on 01 September 2021.

Below is an update from all close down activities that took place in February 2021:

- Contractual updates to existing SPAA contracts that are expected to be terminated once REC goes live;
- Legal drafting for the transition of theft arrangements to REC;
- Creation of interim handover reports for RECCo; and
- Supporting the REC Code Managers with understanding SPAA processes and responsibilities.

Every month we will publish an update on the overall status of the Closure Project.

## NEW CONSOLIDATED METERING CODE OF PRACTICE (MCoP)

In November the MAMCoP Board approved a new Metering Code of Practice which consolidates the existing MAMCoP and AMICoP documents, which provide detailed requirements for meter installers and managers, into a new single code.

The new "MCoP" was implemented on 01 January 2021, and the obligations of both MAMs and AMIs are, for the first time, contained within a single document. ElectraLink have produced a webinar providing an overview of the change and impacts on MAM/AMI requirements, which can be accessed [here](#). The fundamental requirements on MAMs and AMIs have not changed, however the new MCoP contains several new or clarified requirements that will result in new audit questions, and all MAMs/AMIs are encouraged to review how the changes may impact your internal policies or procedures.

Several useful guidance tools have also been produced to assist MAMs and AMIs in understanding how the changes affect you. This includes a new digital, filterable version of the MCoP, which enables parties to filter the obligations specific to them and a new mapping document which details how the existing MAMCoP and AMICoP map to the new MCoP and indicates where new requirements or new audit questions will apply. ## COMMITTEE AND MEETING UPDATES

### SPAA EXPERT GROUP (SEG)

The SPAA Expert Group provides an opportunity for industry participants to discuss SPAA issues, debate Draft Change Proposals and develop formal Change Proposals. The scope of the group will include matters relating to SPAA products and the RGMA Baseline. Issues for discussion by the Expert Group will be either raised by SPAA parties or referred from the SPAA Executive Committee (EC).

The group met on 03 February 2021. Agenda items and discussions included:

- Updates from SPAA Working Groups,
- SCP 443 - Initial Data Load of Customer Contact Data, and
- SDEP Issues/Discussion (Standing Item).

### SPAA Change Board (CB)

The objective of the SPAA Change Board (CB) is to manage the administration of voting by SPAA Parties on both technical and commercial changes to the SPAA and its associated documents.

The SPAA CB convened on 09 February 2021, where one new SPAA Change Proposals (SCPs) was raised for voting.

#### SCP 511 - Application of UTRN process for SMETS1 meters enrolled in DCC - Accepted

Ofgem have published a industry code freeze letter to panels and code bodies for the codes in scope of the Retail Code Consolidation Significant Code Review. The letter outlines Ofgem's expectations on code changes over the months ahead.

## Erroneous Transfer Performance Assurance Board (ETPAB)

The Erroneous Transfer Performance Assurance Board (ETPAB) convened 11 February 2021 where the following items were discussed:

- The ETPAB reviewed the collated responses received following the Report 8 'SLA' letters.
- Performance Monitoring – a monitoring log has been approved by the group and will be reviewed/actioned monthly based on agreed thresholds/follow ups where performance does not improve.
- Transition of the ETPAB to the RECPAB – The SPAA and MRA Secretariat attended a workshop with RECCo, Deloitte and Ofgem on Thursday 04 February where a drafted Transitional handover, prepared by the Secretariats and approved by the ETPAB, was reviewed and any questions addressed. Next steps, RECCo and Deloitte to review the document and highlight any additional information/clarity required.

The next ETPAB will take place on 11 March 2021.
